


• Newsletter Volunteers needed. (Contributors)


Approved volunteer activities are:

You may have noticed construction activity at the entrance of West Lake Park. This is the staging area for a mitigation project that will remove Australian Pines, add a crib system (similar to the one on the south side of Sheridan Street) to stabilize the shoreline and prevent erosion along the Intracoastal Waterway. Additionally, there will be some land side plantings and seagrass areas as well.

The Anatomy of the Trap



Anne Kolb Nature Center is part of the Broward County Park and Recreation System. It is located in West Lake Park, Hollywood, Florida. As you enter the park from Sheridan Street, the 1500 acre mangrove wetland offers ample parking and a welcoming bridge leading to two trails separated by a visitor center, an all- purpose party facility, and an exhibit hall building. The trails (1/4 mile each) are BTW (better than wood) surfaces making for an easy walk. Both trails terminate in West Lake for a turn around. The exhibit hall marks the beginning of the observation tower trail.

The exhibit hall has three rooms for checking out the natural offerings of the mangrove ecosystem. Room one has the little theatre, offering a video ten minutes in length explaining where you are. Room two has displays showing what may live in the estuary. Room three is home to a touch tank and aquaria with living animals. It is in room three where the fish trap lives.

The trap is operated by naturalists and volunteers. It is made of heavyduty vinyl dipped steel mesh. An opening on the side has an easy sliding door with a coiled spring hook for closing. A wide opening on the front extends backwards as a funnel ending as a small opening, making easy entry and difficult escape. When bait is placed inside the trap is ready for work. Just add a length of coated wire and a ferrule for easy carrying.

The aquaria in room three of the exhibit hall depend on the success of the trap. Over a period of many years traps have given visitors a broad understanding of what resides in West Lake. Even some immature

ocean dwelling gamefish make their way into the estuary to play hide and seek until they are big enough to return to the ocean. Some may find the trap too hard to ignore. The list of trap visitors is numerous. Blue crab, rock crab, barracuda and toadfish were caught. Checkered puffer, minnows, and herring have been displayed. Big eye mojarra, grunt, and needlefish did not escape. Add the clown fish, that has orange and white stripes, and pin fish, and you have the work product of the tireless trap.

A visit to the Nature Center does not need an appointment and it's free.



Trashy Kayakers complete their first paddle of the New Year. It was a glorious day with lots of birds on the lake and on the Red and Blue Trails.



























January's Bird Event



















We have a Juvenile Great Blue heron in the park system. This cutie has been spotted by the rocks at Sheridan Street Bridge and over at the Marina basin.


